
INCREASING RURAL EMPLOYMENT

The goal of ARDI program is to increase rural employment by tackling constraints to economic development of target communities in the Syunik, Vayots Dzor and Lori regions of Armenia.

Support in Three Value Chains: Dairy, Fruit and Rural Tourism

Dairy Value Chain Program support includes assessments,

Program support includes assessments, building animal watering places, milk collection and processing units, and creating linkages for suppliers and producers.

7 Milk Collection Centers were completed, each with 510 MT annual capacity.

Animal Watering Places were built in 16 communities, covering 16,315ha additional pastures.

Cheese Production was supported.

Fruit Value Chain

Program support includes assessments, renovating and building irrigation projects, building fruit cold storages and creating linkages for suppliers and producers.

Fruit Cold Storages were completed total of 904,7m³ space.

14 Irrigation Projects were completed covering total 773ha additional area.

Service Center and Laboratory were established

Rural Tourism Value Chain

Program support includes assessments, renovating and building Bed and Breakfast projects, providing ongoing technical assistance, training and forward linkages.

10 B&Bs are established in four communities of different regions with total of 49 beds capacity.
