Our work over the last year continues to create hope and make tangible differences for families and communities in Armenia. The year was inspiring and exciting for Fuller Center for Housing Armenia as we continued to serve families in dire need of housing giving them the opportunity to live in safe and decent homes and building strength, stability and reliance through decent housing.

Notwithstanding all difficulties, this year we have been able to assist 280 families. Since the inception of the organization in 2008, 1298 underprivileged families have enjoyed jubilance of living in their decent homes with all necessities.

OUR MISSION

The Fuller Center for Housing Armenia is a non-governmental, charitable organization that supports low income families to build and renovate simple, decent, and affordable homes providing them with long-term, interest and inflation free loans as well as advocating the right to a decent shelter as a matter of conscience and action. The monthly loan repayments flow into the revolving fund and are used to help more families creating a sustainable financial foundation for community development.



PARTNERSHIP WITH RA GOVERNMENT

The Government of RA entrusted the Fuller Center for Housing Armenia with the implementation of building homes for 159 families living in the disaster zone of Aragatsotn, Shirak, and Lori regions.

AMD 143 358 200 (\$ 296,807) has been invested in Aragatsotn Region to assist 7 families.

AMD 463 479 840 (\$959 585) has been invested in Shirak Region to assist 25 families.

AMD 1 392 587 000 (\$2 886 190) has been invested in Lori Region to assist 127 families.

To remind, another 105 families have been assisted through the RA Government investement during the past years.


PARTNERSHIP WITH VIVA-MTS

In 2021, the leading telecommunications operator in Armenia invested over AMD 230 million (over \$464,000) addressed to assisting 87 families in 66 communities of 10 regions in Armenia.


Altogether, in 10 years, 391 families assisted through decent housing owing to this partnership.



PARTNERSHIP WITH THE INTERNATIONAL COMMITTEE OF THE RED CROSS (ICRC)

2021 was also successful with a continuing partnership with the International Committee of the Red Cross with 33 families assisted. Eight of them have finished the house construction; another 25 families will finish it in 2022.

Altogether, in 12 years, 209 families have been assisted.




PRINCIPAL SOURCES OF INCOME (IN USD)

Join our short-term, 7- to 14-day volunteer trips designed to promote teamwork and offer a spiritual experience in a cross-cultural setting. By working within the local host community, participants have the unique opportunity to personally witness and contribute to the Fuller Center for Housing Armenia's goal to eliminate substandard housing in Armenia.

Who Can Volunteer with Us

Families and individuals of different ages and nationalities. Our most senior volunteer was 86 years old. (We require that children of 14-16 years of age join with guard/elder people)

What You Do as a Volunteer

1. Help build a home for a deserving Armenian family in need of decent housing. Thousands of Armenian families are living in metal containers, unfinished houses, or other substandard temporary shelters. No construction skills are needed, just an open heart and a willingness to work.

2. Visit the breathtaking historical sites of Armenia and try the local organic food!

How to Register

- 3. Fill out an online waiver
- 4. Pay the registration fee

Trip Cost

\$1,000 - \$1,200 one-week option \$1,600 - \$1,800 two-week option plus round-trip airfare.

Trip Cost Includes:

1. Lodging, food, ground transportation, cultural excursions, orientation materials, basic tools for use at the building site, traveller's medical insurance, and transfers to and from the Yerevan airport (EVN)

2. A donation of \$400 to FCHA, which is used to build more homes for low-income families.
